Award: \$500.00 non-renewable scholarship

- Eligibility:
- 1) submit 2-3 paragraphs, prose, or poem showcasing your creative writing skill.
 - 2) submit an essay to include information about yourself showing evidence of your moral character, strong effort, work ethic, and how receiving this scholarship will help you accomplish your goals.

This application must be submitted to the HHHS Guidance Office by April 5, 2024. The check will be made out to the student and the chosen educational institution. It will be awarded in May at the Senior Awards Program.
